Surrealism

Founded by the poet André Breton in Paris in 1924, surrealism was an artistic and literary movement.

It proposed that the Enlightenment—the influential 17th- and 18th-century intellectual movement that championed reason and individualism—had suppressed the (superior) qualities of the irrational, unconscious mind.

Surrealism's goal was to liberate thought, language, and human experience from the oppressive boundaries of rationalism.

So basically:

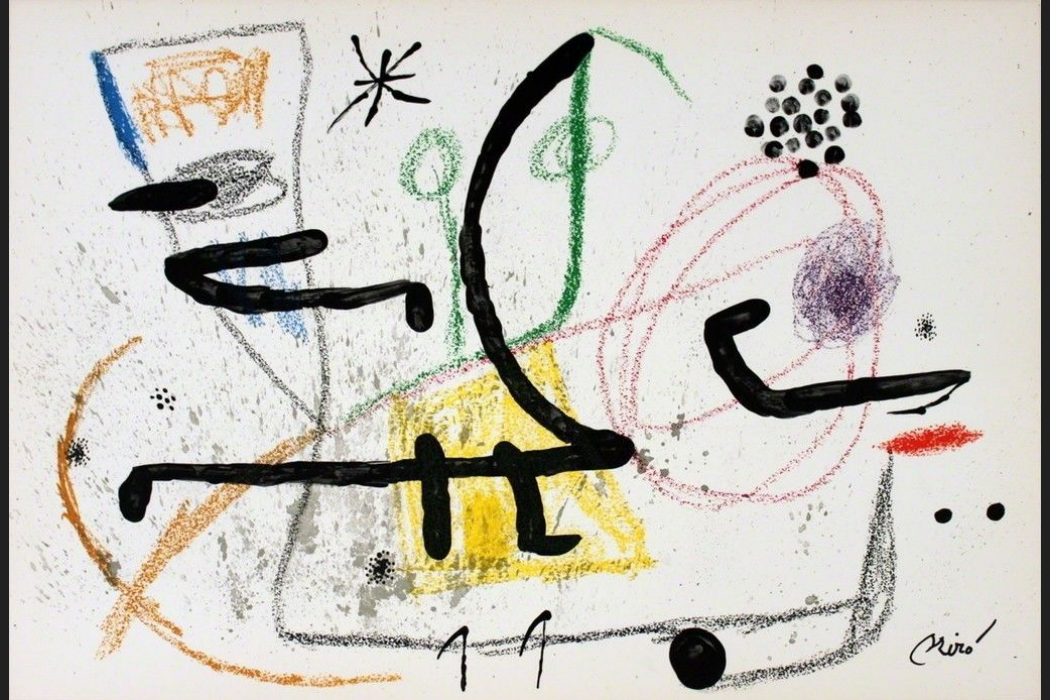
Science, rationality & thinking that makes sense: TIRED.

Free expression, daydreaming, dreams, wandering minds: WIRED.



Surrealism's desire to break free of reason led it to question the most basic foundation of artistic production: the idea that art is the product of a single artist's creative imagination.

The surrealists embraced chance and believed that our collective unconscious would help us bring story and meaning to artwork that didn't make logical sense.

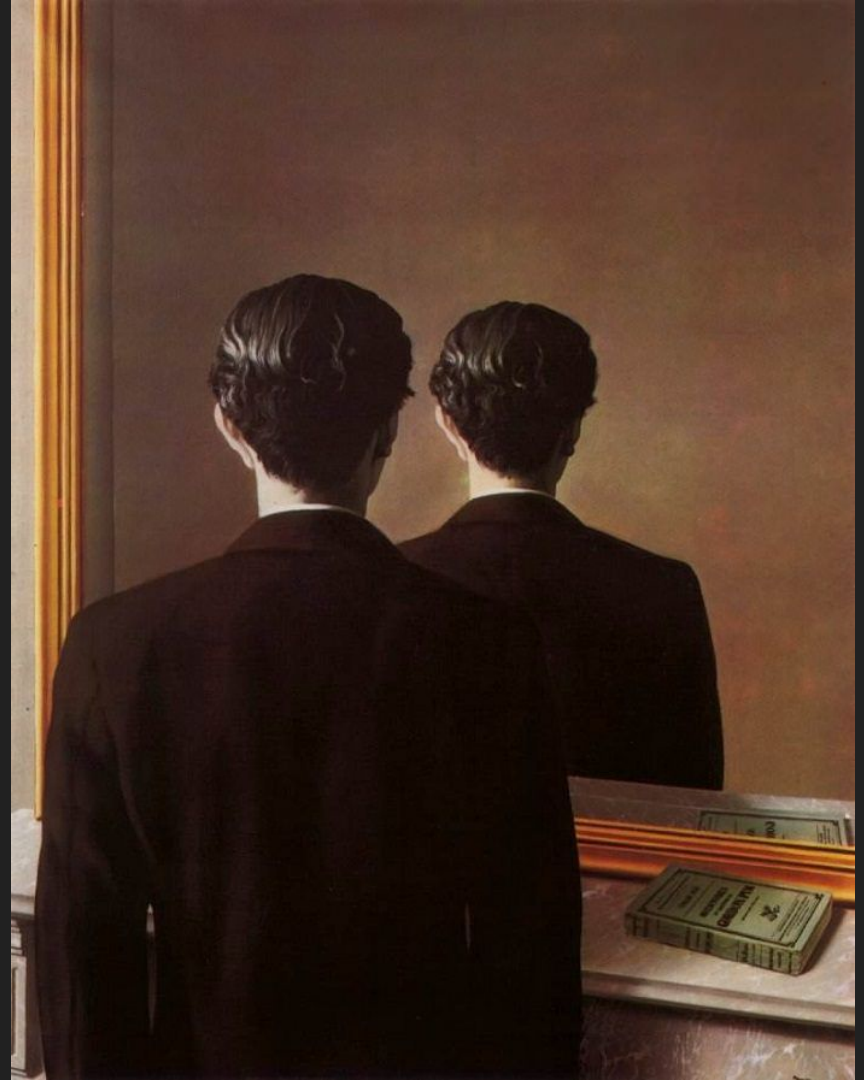

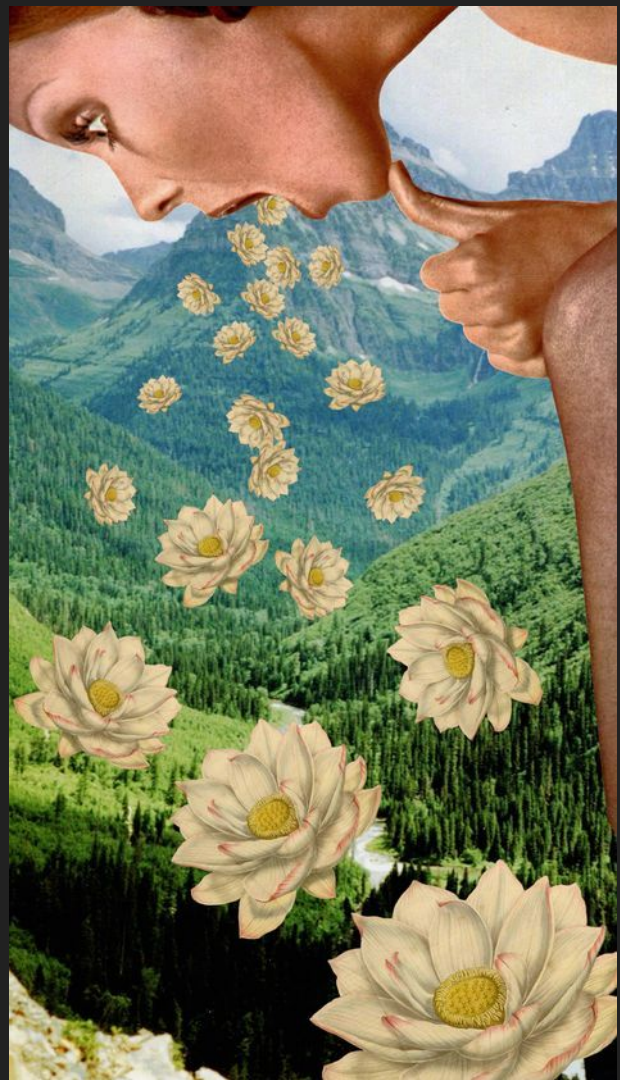

PROMPT: Create a surrealist
self portrait **photomontage**
using Photoshop selection
tools.

Take a picture of yourself **in a deliberate pose** to fit into a composition that expresses something about yourself.

Post to fit into the circumstances of a background space that you choose.

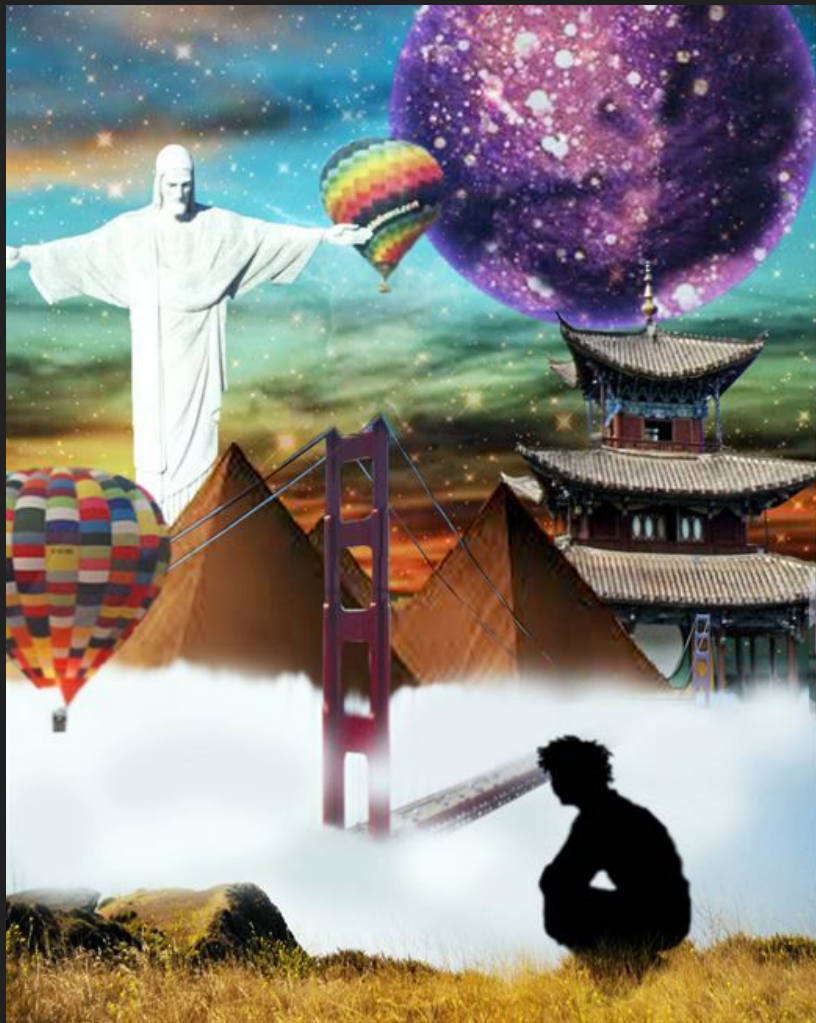
You may use a picture of yourself when you were younger if this makes sense for your concept, or something taken now. (We can scan old photographs if necessary.) *The photograph should be high resolution.*

Use selection tools, layers, image adjustments, and blending modes to add at least five elements to this image that work together to tell a story. Concentrate on making the additions **seamless**.

Keep in mind that our concept is surrealism—so **that story does NOT need to make rational sense**.

Your composition should be visually intriguing, technically correct, and unexpected.

Your image must have a clear **foreground**, **middle ground**, and **background**.

- 1: Masking
- 2: Blending Modes
- 3: Image Adjustments

You must use at least THREE of the Surrealism Techniques:

- 1: Scale
- 2: Levitation
- 3: Juxtaposition
- 4: Dislocation
- 5: Transparency
- 6: Transformation

FORMAT:

9x12, either portrait or landscape, 300 dpi

GETTING STARTED:

Choose a background image. Use a Google Image Search at LARGE. You can also use an image from the LANDSCAPES folder we used in a previous assignment.

Take your picture, or have a classmate take your picture.

Remember that a simple background may make your selection easier.

Add your portrait to the background image first—then start bringing in other imagery. *The selections should make technical sense, but not rational sense!*
